Charles W. Page, Sr. died April 3, 2006 at Sutter Roseville Medical Center of complications relating to a serious infection and his age.

A resident of Placer Co. for the last 10 years, Charles was born April 7, 1915 in El Paso, TX to Charles Henry Page (b. 1886 Nebraska) and Carolina Provencio (b. 1887, Ysleta Valley, Texas). He has also lived in Compton and Fullerton, California for over 40 years, retiring to Sedona, Arizona but returning to California, specifically Placer Co. in 1996.

Charles was a retired Mobil Full Service Station Owner and Operator having been with them and the Standard Oil Company for over 40 years and was granted the Award of Merit from the Mobil Oil Corporation on 3 occasions. During WWII he was a welder in the war industry, working on battleships for Todd Shipyards in San Pedro, California.

Charles was a successful entrepreneur having only a Fourth Grade education, quitting school in order to help support his disabled father's family during the Depression Era.

He is a past member of the Knights of Columbus, Council #2327, Our Lady of Victory Parish, Compton, California, the Moose Lodge in Compton and the Elks Lodge in Fullerton, California.

He is survived by his wife of 68 years, M. Jean Page, sons Charles W. Page, Jr. (wife Miriam Conroy) of Yuba City, California and Stephen Leigh Page (wife Claire Rawcliffe) of Orange, California, six grandchildren and eight great grandchildren. He is also survived by his sister Lucille Martin of Victorville, California.

Preceding him in death were his parents, his brother Edward Page, infant son Page and grandson Charles W. Page III.

There will be a Rosary on Thursday April 6, at 7 p.m. at Ullrey Mortuary and a gravesite service presided by Rev. Loreto Rojas of St. Isidore Parish, at Sutter Cemetery at 11 a.m. Friday, April 7, the day of his 91st birthday.
