M. Jean Page died October 23, 2006 at St. Joseph Hospital of Orange, California of complications relating to her health and age.

A resident of Placer Co. for the last 10 years, and more recently for the last two months in the city of Orange, Jean was born October 28, 1921 in Missoula, Montana to Guy William Martin (b. 1893, Nebraska) and Eleanor Mary Hunter (b. 1896, Mexico). She had also lived in Compton and Fullerton, California for over 40 years, retiring to Sedona, Arizona but returning to California in 1996.

Jean was a retired administrative assistant and office manager for the City of Fullerton's Planning Department, having worked in public service for more than 30 years, including the city of Anaheim and the Orange County Courts. She was the recipient of numerous employee recognition awards over the years. During World War II she was employed as staff to the medical unit of Todd Shipyards in San Pedro, where battleships were repaired during WWII.

She was very active in the Retired Public Employees Association (RPEA) having helped to establish a chapter in the Flagstaff/Sedona, Arizona area. After moving to Orange, she became a charter member of the Park Plaza Red Hat Society, of which she was very proud.

She graduated from El Paso High School at the age of 16, but thinking that was too young to marry she waited to marry her husband the week after she turned 17. She and her husband Charles W. Page, Sr. would have been married 68 years this coming November 4. However, she was preceded in death by Charles, who died April 3 of this year. Also preceding her in death were her siblings Doris Reed and Louise Yerby, an infant son Page and grandson Charles W. Page, III.

She is survived by her sons Charles W. Page, Jr. (wife Miriam Conroy) of Yuba City, California and Stephen Leigh Page (wife Claire Rawcliffe) of Orange, California, six grandchildren and eight great grandchildren.
